

Florida's Income-Based Scholarships



A LEARNING OPTION FOR DISADVANTAGED STUDENTS

Florida's two income-based scholarship programs, the Florida Tax Credit Scholarship (FTC) and Family Empowerment Scholarship for Educational Options (FES-EO), are serving more low-income and working-class students than ever before. Eligible students may choose between financial assistance toward private school tuition or with transportation costs to attend a public school in another district.

2022-23 STEP UP FAST FACTS

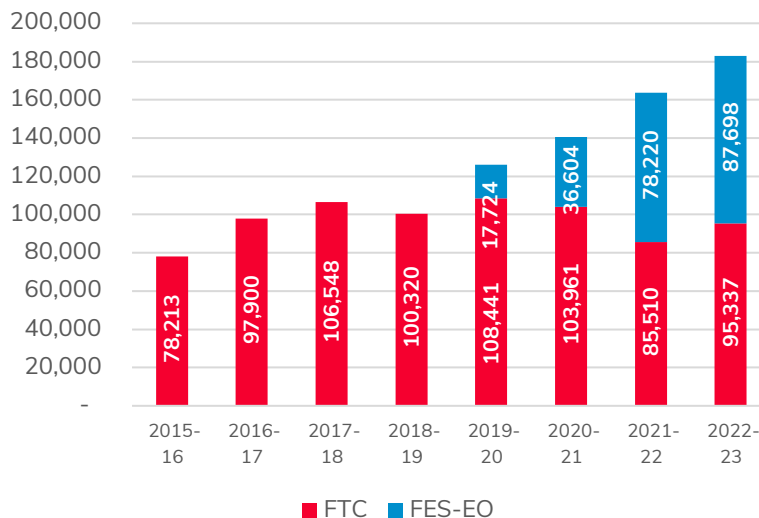
- 95,337 students enrolled on FTC
- 87,698 students enrolled on FES-EO
- Average household income of \$42,795 for a family of four, or 55 percent above poverty
- 63 percent Black or Hispanic
- 51 percent of students live in single-parent households
- 2,090 participating private schools



THE SCHOLARSHIP AND ITS FINANCIAL IMPACT

For the 2022-23 SCHOOL YEAR, the SCHOLARSHIP will average between \$7,250 and \$7,850, depending on grade and county. Renewal students are grandfathered into the old formula, but will receive the higher of the two amounts.

TESTING ACCOUNTABILITY

- ✓ Students in grades 3-10 have been evaluated with state-approved national norm-referenced tests since 2006.
- ✓ Studies show the average scholarship student is among the lowest performers in their prior school. Once on scholarship, students see similar learning gains to all students nationally, regardless of income, and are more likely to attend and graduate
