## FLORIDA TAX CREDIT <br> Scholarship Program

## FEBRUARY 2013 QUARTERLY REPORT

> The Florida Tax Credit (FTC) Scholarship Program was established in 2001 to encourage private, voluntary contributions from corporate donors to non-profit scholarship funding organizations (SFO) that award scholarships to children from low-income families. Step Up For Students is the only approved participating SFO for the $2012-13$ school year. A corporation can receive a dollar-for-dollar tax credit up to 100\% of its state income tax liability. The program also includes credits against the insurance premium tax for contributions to eligible non-profit SFOs, credits against severance taxes on oil and gas production, self-accrued sales tax liabilities of direct pay permit holders, and alcoholic beverage taxes on beer, wine, and spirits. The maximum amount the state may award is $\$ 229$ million in credits for the $2012-2013$ fiscal year. This program expands educational opportunities and school choice for children of families that have limited financial resources.
