The Florida Tax Credit Scholarship Program

The Florida Tax Credit (FTC) Scholarship Program was established in 2001 to encourage private, voluntary contributions from corporate donors to non-profit scholarship funding organizations (SFOs) that award scholarships to children from low-income families. Step Up For Students was the only approved participating SFO for the 2012-13 school year. A corporation can receive a dollar-for-dollar tax credit up to 100% of its state income tax liability. The program also includes credits against the insurance premium tax for contributions to eligible non-profit SFOs, credits against severance taxes on oil and gas production, self-accrued sales tax liabilities of direct pay permit holders, and alcoholic beverage taxes on beer, wine, and spirits. The maximum amount the state may award was \$229 million in credits for the 2012-2013 fiscal year. This program expands educational opportunities and school choice for children of families that have limited financial resources.

Summary of the June 2013 FTC Quarterly Report

The June FTC Quarterly Report is also considered the annual report because it is based on the cumulative data submitted by the Scholarship Funding Organizations (SFOs) for students who participated in the FTC Scholarship Program at any point during the 2012-2013 school year.

In 2012-2013, Step Up For Students awarded a total of approximately \$207 million in FTC scholarships to 51,075 students enrolled in 1,338 participating Florida private schools.

The 51,075 students in 2012-2013 is an increase of 10,827 students over the 2011-2012 student total of 40,248 as reported in the June 2012 FTC Quarterly Report. This represents an enrollment increase of 27%. The 1,338 private schools participating in 2012-2013 represent an increase of 10% from the 1,216 private schools that participated during the 2011-2012 school year.

Some characteristics of the FTC student data include:

- Slightly more female students (51%) participate in the FTC program than male students (49%).
- The lower grade levels tend to have the larger student enrollments. Students enrolled in Kindergarten through Grade 3 make up approximately 53% of the scholarship recipients.
- The racial/ethnic breakdown reflects the diversity of students utilizing the FTC scholarship, which includes:

African-American students (33%) Hispanic students (35%) White students (25%) Other students (7%)

• The top five districts (Dade, Orange, Duval, Broward, and Hillsborough) had 29,342 students (57% of total participants) receiving \$120 million in FTC scholarships (58% of total funding).



FTC Student Participation and Funding by District



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
FTC Student Enrollment by Gender









Private Schools Participating in FTC by Type
