September 2014 Quarterly Report

The Florida Tax Credit (FTC) Scholarship Program established in 2001 to encourage private, voluntary contributions donors non-profit scholarship corporate to funding organizations (SFOs) that award scholarships to children from families. Scholarship **Funding** Organizations low-income Two (SFOs) have been approved to participate for the 2014-15 school year. A corporation can receive a dollar-for-dollar tax credit up to 100% of its state income tax liability. The program also includes credits against the insurance premium tax for contributions to eligible non-profit SFOs, credits against severance taxes on oil and gas production, self-accrued sales tax liabilities of direct pay permit holders, and alcoholic beverage taxes on beer, wine, and spirits. The maximum amount the state may award is \$357.8 million in credits for the 2014-15 fiscal year. This program expands educational opportunities and school choice for children of families that have limited financial resources.





FTC Student Enrollment by Gender




FTC Student Enrollment by Grade Level






FTC Student Enrollment by Type of Private School
