

Florida's two private school scholarship programs, the Florida Tax Credit Scholarship (FTC) and Family Empowerment Scholarship for Educational Options (FES-EO) serve more than 240,000 students today. Of them, more than 107,000 students are eligible for the Federal Free or Reduced Price Lunch Program, a proxy for students living in poverty. Eligible students may choose between financial assistance toward private school tuition, at-home education scholarship or with transportation costs to attend a different public school.

## THE SCHOLARSHIP AND ITS FINANCIAL IMPACT



For the 2023-24 SCHOOL YEAR, the SCHOLARSHIP values vary by grade and county, but average between \$7,550 and \$8,200. Renewal students are grandfathered into the old formula, but will receive the higher of the two amounts.

## **TESTING ACCOUNTABILITY**

- ✓ Students in grades 3-10 have been evaluated with state-approved national norm-referenced tests since 2006.
- ✓ Studies show the average scholarship student is among the lowest performers in their prior school. Once on scholarship, students see similar learning gains to all students nationally, regardless of income, and are more likely to attend and graduate
