February 2022 Quarterly Report

Tax Credit (FTC) Scholarship Program was established in 2001 to encourage private, voluntary contributions from corporate donors to non-profit scholarship funding organizations (SFOs) that award scholarships to children from low-income families. Two Scholarship Fundina **Organizations** (SFOs) are approved to participate for the 2021-22 school year. A corporation can receive a dollar-for-dollar tax credit up to 100% of its state income tax liability. The program also includes credits the insurance premium against non-profit SFOs, credits against contributions eligible severance taxes on oil and gas production, self-accrued sales tax liabilities of direct pay permit holders, and on beer, wine, and spirits. The maximum beverage taxes amount the state may award is \$873 million in credits for the program fiscal vear. This expands educational opportunities and school choice for children of families that have limited financial resources.

This report contains private school and student statistics for the September 2021, November 2021, and February 2022 payment periods of the 2021-22 school year.





FTC Student Enrollment by Gender






FTC Student Enrollment by Race/Ethnicity



FTC Student Enrollment by SFO




