

Florida Tax Credit Scholarship Program

November 2022 Quarterly Report

Tax Credit (FTC) Scholarship Program was The Florida established in 2001 to encourage private, voluntary contributions from corporate donors to non-profit scholarship funding organizations (SFOs) that award scholarships to children from low-income families. Two Scholarship Fundina Organizations (SFOs) are approved to participate for the 2022-23 school year. A corporation can receive a dollar-for-dollar tax credit up to 100% of its state income tax liability. The program also includes credits the insurance premium against tax for contributions non-profit SFOs, credits against to eligible severance taxes on oil and gas production, self-accrued sales tax liabilities of direct pay permit holders, and alcoholic on beer, wine, and spirits. The maximum beverage taxes amount the state may award is \$1.09 billion in credits for the program 2022-23 fiscal vear. This expands educational opportunities and school choice for children of families that have limited financial resources.

This report contains private school and student statistics for the September 2022 and November 2022 payment periods of the 2022-23 school year.







FTC Student Enrollment by Gender






FTC Student Enrollment by Race/Ethnicity



FTC Student Enrollment by SFO


